

Eligibility for the Globalization, Ethnicity and Development Minor

Any undergraduate student may enroll in courses required for the minor, subject to availability. To complete the Minor Program of Study in Globalization, Ethnicity and Development, students must submit a “Globalization, Ethnicity and Development Minor Application” form. Forms are available in 133 Warren Hall and completed forms should be submitted to the Development Sociology Undergraduate Program Coordinator.

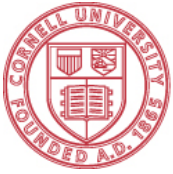
Students will retain a copy of the form and be responsible for planning their minor program of study in conjunction with their major advisor. Students and advisors with questions about the minor should contact the Development Sociology Department Director of Undergraduate Studies, Tom Hirschl, or Undergraduate Program Coordinator, Renee Hoffman. The Development Sociology Director of Undergraduate Studies or the Undergraduate Program Coordinator will assist minors in course selection.

In the student’s final semester, he or she must submit an “Application to Graduate” form. In order to verify the completion of the Minor Program of Study in Globalization, Ethnicity and Development, the student must bring a copy of his or her transcript (it need not be an official copy) to the Undergraduate Program Coordinator for verification that all required courses have been satisfactorily completed or are in the process of being completed. The Undergraduate Program Coordinator will verify on the “Application to Graduate” form that the requirements for the Minor Program of Study in Globalization, Ethnicity and Development have been completed.

How to receive credit for a Minor in Globalization, Ethnicity and Development in the Department of Development Sociology

1. Before the second semester of your junior year, meet at least once with the Undergraduate Coordinator in the Department of Development Sociology.
2. Submit a copy of this form to the Department of Development Sociology, 133 Warren Hall. Retain a copy for your records and give a copy to your advisor.
3. Complete the Development Sociology core courses, and select the ethnic and area program courses, that are most appropriate to your interests.
4. In the final semester prior to graduation, bring a copy of your transcript and your “Application to Graduate” to the Department of Development Sociology, 133 Warren Hall. Upon verification of successful completion of the required courses, a designated representative of the Department of Development Sociology will sign the form as required for the minor.
