

## **Eligibility for the General Minor in Development Sociology**

Any undergraduate student in CALS may enroll, subject to availability, in courses required for the minor. To complete the Minor Program of Study in Development Sociology, students must submit a form, "Minor Program of Study" available in 133 Warren Hall.

Students will retain a copy of the form and be responsible for planning their minor program of study in conjunction with their advisor in their major. Students and advisors in other departments should contact the Department of Development Sociology Undergraduate Program Coordinator in 333 Warren Hall if they have questions about Development Sociology courses. The Undergraduate Program Coordinator will assist minors in course selection.

In the student's final semester, he or she must submit an "Application to Graduate" form. In order to verify the completion of the Minor Program of Study in Development Sociology, the student must bring a copy of his or her transcript (it need not be an "official" copy) to the Undergraduate Program Coordinator for verification that all required courses have been satisfactorily completed or are in the process of being completed. Upon review of satisfactory transcripts, the Undergraduate Program Coordinator will verify on the "Application to Graduate" form that the requirements for the Minor in Development Sociology have been completed.

In order to receive any consideration of priority in course enrollment, a form must have been submitted prior to the semester in which enrollment is desired. Please note that admission to the minor does not guarantee that a student will be able to take a given Development Sociology course in a given semester, any more than being a Development Sociology major offers any such guarantee.

## **How to receive credit for a General Minor in the Department of Development Sociology**

1. Before the second semester of your junior year, meet at least once with the Undergraduate Coordinator in the Department of Development Sociology.
2. Submit a copy of this form to the Department of Development Sociology, 133 Warren Hall. Retain a copy for your records and give a copy to your advisor.
3. Complete the Development Sociology core courses, and select the advanced courses, that are most appropriate to your interests.
4. In the final semester prior to graduation, bring a copy of your transcript and your “Application to Graduate” to the Department of Development Sociology, 133 Warren Hall. Upon verification of successful completion of the required courses, a designated representative of the Department of Development Sociology will sign the form as required for the minor.
